The Gates Scholarship	The full cost of attendance not covered by other financial aid and the EFC	4	Must be a high school senior who is African- American, Asian & Pacific Islander American, Hispanic American or American Indian/Alaska Native (who are enrolled in a tribe). Must be Federal Pell Grant eligible. Must be a U.S. citizen, national or permanent resident. Must have GPA 3.3 or better; should be in top 10% of their graduating class. Must plan to enroll full time at a four-year accredited U.S. college or university. No restrictions on major. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (high school GPA will be considered for incoming freshmen). Must be on track to receive a bachelor's degree in a technical science or engineering discipline. Must be a minority student. Must demonstrate financial need.
CoffeeForLess.com "Hit the Books" Scholarship	\$500	2, 4	Must be aged 18-25 and enrolled in an accredited college or university. Must submit an essay of no more than 500 words on the importance of education in their lives and how the scholarship money (to be used for educational books and materials) will assist the students' goals. Bonus points will be awarded to those students who find a creative way to include their passion for coffee within their essay without losing sight of the primary topic. Winners based upon two criteria: successful accomplishment of essay subject matter and individual student needs.
